- Identify and discuss the assessment methods used to determine spasticity, dystonia and other movement disorders in cerebral palsy
- Discuss the clinical relevance, validity and assessment of selective voluntary motor control in cerebral palsy
- Describe and discuss the use of a perception/action framework to develop sensori-motor intervention with infants and children and their families
- Discuss current approaches to clinical decision-making in the management of spasticity, dystonia and function in patients with cerebral palsy
- Make appropriate referrals for patients with cerebral palsy

## Special Guest Speaker

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### **Linda Fetters, PhD, PT**

Dr. Fetters is Professor and Director of the Development of Infant Motor Performance Laboratory (DIMPL), Division of Biokinesiology and Physical Therapy and Department of Pediatrics, Keck School of Medicine, at the University of Southern California. Her research is focused on improving the quality of life for infants and children with movement difficulties due to neurological insults. She has studied the impact of in-utero drug exposure on sensorimotor development. Most recently Dr. Fetters studied the coordination of infants born prematurely with very low birth weight and central nervous system white matter damage. She has developed very early physical therapy treatments using an innovative computerized mobile paradigm for those infants who are at risk for developing cerebral palsy. Dr. Fetters teaches development, pediatric physical therapy and evidence-based physical therapy practice. She has developed distance education in physical therapy and taught evidence-based physical therapy practice in a distance format. Dr. Fetters is on the editorial board of the journals *Pediatric Physical Therapy* and *Revista Brasileira De Fisioterapia (Physical Therapy Journal of Brazil)*. She has taught and given scientific presentations throughout the United States, Sweden, the Netherlands, Tanzania, Taiwan, Japan and Brazil. Dr. Fetters received the Research Award from the Massachusetts Chapter of the APTA and the Pediatric Section Research Award of APTA. She has recently been appointed to the Scientific Review Committee of the Foundation for Physical Therapy.
