- Toys to Promote Learning Through Movement** ♦ The workshop will be led by our guest speaker Linda Fetters, P T, PhD FAPTA and Loretta Staudt MS, PT. The workshop will show you how to select and modify typical toys to encourage movement and promote intellectual activity and learning in infants and children with CP. Dr. Fetters is Professor and Director of the Development of Infant Motor Performance Laboratory, Division of Biokinesiology and Physical Therapy and Department of Pediatrics, Keck School of Medicine, at the USC. Loretta Staudt is a member of the Center for Cerebral Palsy team and a UCLA Intervention Program physical therapist.
- Taking Charge of Your Own Health** ♦ Joan Earle Hahn, PhD, APRN, BC, CDDN is an advanced practice nurse on faculty in the UCLA School of Nursing and a member of the Center for Cerebral Palsy team specializing in health care for people with developmental disabilities. Dr. Hahn will discuss how teenagers and adults with CP improve their health by becoming actively involved. Ways of taking charge of preventative health care, annual check-ups and healthy choices in diet and exercise will be addressed.
